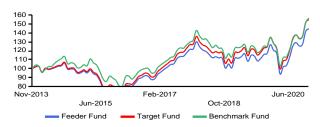

Investment selection is driven by fundamental, research-driven analysis. In constructing portfolios, they look carefully at diversification, investment correlation, macroeconomic outlook, and benchmark alignment, where appropriate.

NAVPU Over the Past 12 Months

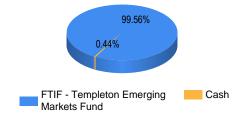

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

(from the Templeton Emerging Markets Fund Monthly Commentary dated December 31, 2020)

An uncertain regulatory backdrop held back Alibaba and Tencent. From their observations, China's internet industry has experienced periods of heightened scrutiny in the past, and business models offering superior user experiences and efficiencies have weathered such episodes to a large extent.

Though further regulatory news could drive share-price volatility for Alibaba and Tencent in the near term, the Fund Manager believes both companies have distinct competitive advantages that should secure their structural earnings power. They continue to view them as well-diversified and resilient companies with longer-term growth drivers across multiple areas such as e-commerce and cloud computing.

Meanwhile, Samsung Electronics surged. The Fund Manager sees growing demand and disciplined capacity expansion supporting the memory chip market's upturn, which could benefit Samsung. They also think its foundry, smartphone, and other businesses have fared well amidst the pandemic.

Key EMs, particularly in East Asia, substantially outperformed other countries in terms of health outcomes, economic resilience, and equity returns in 2020. Many companies successfully executed during the pandemic and should emerge from the crisis with stronger competitive positions, in their view. The Fund Manager continues to closely monitor the pace of recovery in what they consider to be good-quality companies that have corrected significantly beyond the limited near-term impact to their intrinsic values.

The challenges of 2020 have highlighted structural advantages and other beneficial secular trends in EMs that the Fund Manager believes bode well for 2021. The resilience of key markets in East Asia during the crisis, paired with their ability to capitalize on secular shifts to the new economy, should drive their continued strength. Laggards, including India and Brazil, stand to benefit from a uniquely accommodative environment of negative real rates, ongoing reform efforts, and excess capacity in their economies to support growth.

A broadening economic recovery in EMs should continue to drive improved earnings visibility into 2021. The Fund Manager sees compelling opportunities to invest in companies that demonstrate sustainable earnings power, trading at discounts to their assessment of their intrinsic worth. They are confident in a long runway of growth for innovative and technology-driven companies extending their leads in areas such as semiconductors and internet services. They also favor companies that could benefit from longer-term consumption growth in EMs, reflected in a rising penetration of goods and services or a "premiumization" in demand.

However, the Fund Manager expects COVID-19 to remain prevalent in 2021. While some countries have already started inoculation, the production and distribution of vaccines in sufficient scale are challenges equal to their development. As a result, they expect many countries to continue experiencing sporadic COVID-19 outbreaks, which could add volatility to the underlying trend of economic and market recovery.
